
'I started shaking'

■ Treasure hunters describe historic \$4.5 million find

During his first season as a treasure hunter, Dan Beckingham of Micco didn't expect to find much.

That's because until July 30, all Beckingham and the rest of the Capitana crew found were some silver coins and other artifacts off the coast of Wabasso. Then suddenly their luck changed. They struck gold.

"I was excited just to be on the boat," said Beckingham, during a news conference Thursday at the Capt Hiram's Resort in Sebastian, where the 350 gold coins worth \$4.5 million were on display. "I never even imagined finding anything like this."

The coins are part of the lost treasure from the 1715 Fleet shipwreck, comprised of 11 galleons laden with treasures from the New World bound for Spain. But all 11 ships were lost during a hurricane off the coast of Florida on July 31, 1715 and most of the treasure still lies beneath the ocean.

Brent Brisben, owner of the Sebastian-based 1715 Fleet-Queens Jewels LLC, started his quest to recover gold and silver off the Treasure Coast in 2010 after acquiring the salvage rights from the family of famed treasure hunter Mel Fisher. Brisben owns and captains



"Indescribable — it's hard to put it into words," diver William Bartlett (front) said of the find. "The experience was surreal," Bartlett said. "You keep asking yourself if it's really happening."

Brisben didn't believe the crew at first when they reported what they had found and asked Martinez to text him a picture.

"I told him we hit big," Martinez said. "I kept telling him it was for real and he should meet me at the dock to see it for himself."

All three crew members will share their find with Brisben and the state, which is entitled to 20 percent of whatever is recovered at the end of the year.

"We won't get legal title to the coins until next year," Brisben said. "Each guy then gets a share and can do whatever he wants with it"

Despite being covered by sand and seawater for 300 years, the coins are untarnished, Brisben said, including nine "Royals," which were made for the King of Spain, Philip V, in the early 1700s.

Brisben said he held off announcing his find to make sure all the coins were retrieved from that area of the ocean floor. He added that the discovery was magical because the 300-plus coins were discovered on the 300th anniversary of the shipwreck.

"There is an energy that pervades these ship-wrecks," Brisbane said. "If you asked me five or six years ago when I first got into this, I would have never believed. But when you have these types of finds, it makes you realize it is really out there."
